Tournament Details

Venue: Perth Chess Club, North Woodvale Primary School (Chichester Drive, Woodvale).

Format: Swiss (Dutch variant), with 11 rounds, to be rated on the December 2023 ACF Quick list.

Vega software (JaVaFo engine) for pairings. FIDE Laws of Chess apply.

Divisions: There will be two separate sections:

Open (all players eligible, FIDE Blitz rated)
Junior (all players born in 2005 or later)

The Junior section would be well suited to new tournament players, or those rated under 1000 ACF. Stronger and more experienced young players can choose to compete in the

Open for a greater challenge.

Time Control: 3 minutes with 2 second increment per move from move 1.

Schedule: 1:30pm – Entries Close 3:10pm – Rounds 5-8

Information: During games, possession of communication devices and other electronic devices capable of

suggesting chess moves is strictly forbidden. While a player's games are in progress, all such devices that he/she has brought to the venue must be completely switched off and stored either in a separate bag within the playing area, or face-down on his/her table. Spectators and players whose games in the current round have finished are not bound by this rule, but we ask that

phones be kept on silent mode so as not to disturb the players.
